Artist of the Week- LS Lowry

LS Lowry was an English artist. His drawings and paintings mainly depict Pendlebury, Greater Manchester (where he lived and worked for more than 40 years) as well as Salford and its vicinity. Lowry is famous for painting scenes of life in the industrial districts of North West England in the mid-20th century. He developed a distinctive style of painting and is best known for his urban landscapes peopled with human figures, often referred to as "matchstick men".

Inspirational Person of the Week- Marcus Rashford

Marcus Rashford is a Premier League footballer who currently plays for Manchester United and England.

Marcus was born on 31st October 1997 in Wythenshawe, Manchester.

Marcus plays in the position of forward and wears the number 10 shirt. To date, he has played in more than 150 matches, scoring over 50 goals. With Manchester United, Marcus has won the FA Cup, the League Cup, the Community Shield and the Europa League.

In 2019, Marcus started a campaign called 'In the Box'. It encourages people to fill shoeboxes with items for homeless people in the run-up to Christmas. Suggested items include toothpaste and toothbrushes, wet wipes, gloves and socks. Marcus had the idea after he and his family had delivered gifts to homeless people across Manchester in 2018. Marcus described helping the homeless as 'one of the most gratifying moments of the year.'



Marcus continued his campaign to end child poverty. He started a petition to end child food poverty and asked the government to allocate funding to help feed more children, especially during school holidays. The petition got over one million signatures. On 8th November 2020, the government announced that £400 million would be spent on providing food for families in the UK.





Musician of the Week- Hans Zimmer

Hans Zimmer is a German film score composer and music producer. He has won two Oscars and four Grammys, and has been nominated for two Emmys and a Tony. Zimmer was also named on the list of Top 100 Living Geniuses. He has composed many music scores for films- such as The Lion King, Gladiator, Pirate of the Caribbean and Madagascar.

- He was born on 12th September 1957 in Frankfurt, West Germany.
- He is a German film composer and music producer.
- He is a self-taught piano-player.
- In the 1970s, he played the keyboard and synthesizer in several bands.
- He has composed music for more than 150 films including 'The Lion King,' 'Madagascar', the 'Pirates of the Caribbean' series, 'Gladiator' and 'The Dark Knight' Trilogy.
- He has received many awards, including a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

WhatsApp Scam - be vigilant

Be aware that a recent scam has been targeting Northamptonshire phones on WhatsApp.

Here are details of how the scam works:

WhatsApp users are targeted by posing as a friend and asking for a security code.

The criminal, posing as your friend or someone that's a member of a WhatsApp group you're in, will then send you seemingly normal messages to try and start a conversation with you. However, around the same time you will receive a text message from WhatsApp with a six-digit code. This is because the criminal has been trying to login to WhatsApp using your mobile number. The criminal will claim that they sent you their code by accident and ask you to help them by sending it to them. Once the criminal has this code, they can login to your WhatsApp account and lock you out.

The criminal will then use the same tactic with your WhatsApp contacts in an effort to steal more accounts and use them to perpetrate fraud.





WhatsApp Scam – be vigilant

What you need to do:

- Set up two-step verification to give an extra layer of protection to your account: Tap
 Settings > Account >Two-step verification > Enable.
- THINK. CALL. If a family member or friend makes an unusual request on WhatsApp,
 always call the person to confirm their identity.
- Never share your account's activation code (that's the 6 digit code you receive via SMS)
- You can report spam messages or block a sender within WhatsApp. Press and hold on the message bubble, select 'Report' and then follow the instructions.







This exhibition of textiles and mixed media work has been created by the Visualise textile group. Formed in Northamptonshire several years ago by like-minded artists the group enjoy creating diverse work with stitch as the common thread.

Wendy Bates, Janet Gosling, Sandra Jenkins, Thérèse Kane, Karin Kirk, Sue Latimer, Dora Mack, Mary Martin, Joy Norman, Alyssa Robinson, Jane Stock and Val Taylor meet regularly in Welford, Northamptonshire, with the aim of promoting creativity with rigorous discipline, underpinned by an interest in the history of textiles worldwide. On display are abstract and realistic pieces of art using a wide variety of media: paper, fabric (new, distressed and recycled) and found objects: these are hand and machine stitched, or felted to create art inspired by both the natural world and the built environment. 



Lionesses 'legacy'



The Lionesses (England women's national football team) have achieved their legacy goal of creating fairer and more equal access to sport in schools! It has been announced that the government will be investing £600 million over two academic years to ensure every girl in England is given equal access to all school sports, including football. Everyone will also receive at least 2 hours of physical education per week. 23 members of the England squad, which created history by winning their first major women's tournament at Wembley last July, wrote an open letter to the government. Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak said, 'Last year the Lionesses' victory changed the game. Young girls know when they take to the pitch that football is forthern and, thanks to the

Lionesses, they too could be a part of the next generation to bring it home for their country. We want schools to build on this legacy.' Football Association figures show that, currently, only 67% of all schools and 41% of secondary schools offer football equally to girls and boys in PE lessons. The figures also highlight that only 46% of schools provide the same extracurricular opportunities for boys and girls. England captain, Leah Williamson spoke about the announcement saying, The success of the summer has inspired so many young girls to pursue their passion for football. We see it as our responsibility to open the doors for them to do so and this announcement makes that possible. This is the legacy that we want to live much longer than us as a team.'

Cat and rabbit co-parents

A cat and a rabbit at Roberson Creek Farm, an animal sanctuary in Tobaccoville, North Carolina, are raising their newborns together! Wildlife rescuer and owner of the farm, Destiny Hampton, was surprised to discover that Chrissy the cat had moved into the hutch that she had set up for Amy the rabbit and her bunny babies, and had her own litter of kittens in there. Staff initially tried to separate the new mums, fearing that they would not get on with each other's babies, but the opposite happened, and they became quite upset

until they were all housed back together. The two families all cuddle up together and Chrissy even feeds the baby rabbits. 'They get along great,' stated Destiny on social media, 'They all want to be together, the babies and the mothers. It's so weird, because cats move their babies a lot [but] Chrissy... doesn't. I think maybe she knew that the rabbit mom wasn't making enough milk and wanted to help her.'

NASA's new spacesuits

NASA and Axiom Space have unveiled the new spacesuit design that will be used during its Artemis moon landing missions. The new prototype suits, designed by US company Axiom Space based in Houston, are the most advanced moon suits to date. The new suits, which are the result of the first major space suit redesign in 40 years, will provide more mobility and protection for the lunar explorers. The spacesuits are designed to be comfortable for both men and women and are more flexible, allowing for greater movement. The bubble helmet provides better visibility, lighting, and a mount for a high-definition camera. 'We're developing a spacesuit for a new generation,' said Robert D. Cabana, NASA's associate administrator. Astronauts will wear the Axiom suits during the Artemis III mission, the program's first moon landing. This isn't how the suits will actually look though, as they will be white instead of dark, so that they reflect the heat from the sun instead of absorbing it. The suits that travel to the Moon in 2025 will also have an outer insulation layer to protect the astronauts from extreme temperatures, radiation and dust that occurs on the surface of the Moon, NASA describes the Artemis mission on its website, saying that, 'With Artemis missions, NASA will land the first woman and first person of colour on the Moon, using innovative

technologies to explore more of the lunar surface than ever before.'


