



Over the next 2 weeks I will be going into every class to complete this terms Protective Behaviour lesson.


We are focusing on how our body can physically tell us how we are feeling.

We will be looking at a book called 'listening to my body' and thinking about how our body tells us we are feeling worried, and then what to do about this. We will be learning what sensation and regulated mean, so we can begin to better understand our emotions and how to respond to them.

Examples:

- -butterflies in tummy
- -racing heart
- -jelly legs

I will be reminding the children of the work we completed last half term, which is talking to our trusted adults if we feel sad or worried.

Picture News Peace Chains





Rare Rhino Baby Born

Chester Zoo has been celebrating the birth of a critically endangered eastern black rhino. The female rhino was born on soft sand during the daylight hours (14:45) on 12th November, and is reported to be doing very well along with her mother, Zuri. Commenting on the amazing event, rhino team manager Emma Evison said, 'We'd been eagerly awaiting this birth for 15 long months and, as it's quite unusual for a rhino to give birth in daylight hours, we really didn't expect it to happen right in front of us as we were going about our day. To be able to witness the calf safely entering the world, in front of our very own eves, was just the most incredible privilege.' Only around 600 eastern black rhinos are estimated to be living in the wild in Kenya, Tanzania, and Rwanda. Scientists

believe that births like this one will help prevent the species from being lost altogether. 'This precious newborn's arrival is another positive step in safeguarding the species, which is what the endangered species breeding program in European conservation zoos, that we're a leading part of, is striving to do,' explained Evison. Chester Zoo is inhabited by over 27,000 animals, they say; 'We love wildlife. We care about nature. And we want to be the BEST 700 in the WORLD!'

A black rhino's skin can be up to 5cm thick, they are smaller than white rhinos and they use their hooked lip to pluck at bushes and branches for food.
