


Before you go to the shop (part 1 of 2)



1. Choose the shop you want to go to. Not all supermarkets are available!




2. Wait to receive a link from your school (this may be via SMS or email)




3. Open the link on your phone, check the value of the voucher and plan your shop


Before you go to the shop (part 2 of 2)



4. Follow the steps and choose your supermarket. This can't be undone, so choose the right one!



5. Click to confirm your supermarket choice.



6. Opens in a new window. Keep this safe (perhaps screen grab it just in case).

2. At the checkout, choose the option for a Gift card, or say to the person at the checkout 'I have a Gift card' and then scan the code

Common questions and info...

What happens if I don't have a smartphone or internet access?

In those circumstances, your school can provide an alternative, such as a printed version. Please let them know and I'm sure they will be able to help.

What happens if I have a smartphone, but no data when I am out and about?

In those circumstances, all you need to do is to grab the voucher when you are on wifi and then head out with it already on screen. To be extra certain, take a screen grab of the voucher's contents. It should still scan just fine.

Can they be spent online?

Most are not redeemable for online purchases. You can use your voucher for online shopping at Asda, M&S and Waitrose.

How often will I get them?

This is decided by the school and they will inform you of this.

- 1.** Find the perfect spot to do your Big Schools' Birdwatch. It can help to put up some feeders a couple of weeks in advance. We've got some advice on making these at www.rspb.org.uk/schoolswildchallenge.
- 2.** Do your Birdwatch! Find a place where the children can watch the birds without disturbance, then encourage them to use our simple survey sheets to record what they see.
- 3.** Tell us your results. Complete the online form with your class (rspb.org.uk/schoolswatch) between **5 January – 21 February**. This bit's really important, even if you don't see anything on the day. Once you've submitted your sightings, you'll see a graph breaking down your results, and you'll also receive an email with a downloadable certificate to print out for your class.

Once you've completed your Birdwatch and sent in your results, you can use this as one of your **Wild Challenge** activities. You'll find more ideas for taking part in the Wild Challenge award in this pack and online.

Battling Robins

Ah the robin: that beautiful cute cuddly little bird seen in peaceful Christmas card scenes and the Netflix animation [Robin Robin](#). But all isn't quite what it seems...

[Robins](#) are actually tough as nails with fire in their belly as well as on their chest. A good feeding patch is well worth defending, and that is exactly what they are doing when you hear them singing in mid-winter or see them chasing off anything that might have an eye on their worms.



Wee Wrens

Another of our smallest birds, the wren, is easier to spot at this time of year as they'll be out frantically searching for insects to eat. The lack of insects and their small size makes them particularly vulnerable to cold weather, and in the most severe winters populations can dramatically decline.


Their scientific name is Troglodytidae which means 'cave dweller'. This reflects their habits of nesting and searching for food in gaps and crevices. Many defend territories where they know there will be a good supply of food but the differences are often put aside on an evening when they come together to roost to keep warm.





Use parental controls on your child's iPhone, iPad and iPod touch

With Content & Privacy Restrictions in Screen Time, you can block or limit specific apps and features on your child's device. You can also restrict the settings on your iPhone, iPad or iPod touch for explicit content, purchases and downloads, and privacy.



Apple devices have a range of features available to support parents in monitoring and restricting what their child is able to do not just online but on an Apple device.

All Apple devices have the ability to set restrictions on purchases, downloads, viewable content and web access. Additionally, you can set a time limit for a device and prevent certain apps from being access or installed.


How many books have you read?






How does it work?

1-Minute Maths offers children engaging and easily accessible practice in basic number. There's no specific route or starting point. Having chosen a topic, each user answers a series of randomly generated questions (a different set of questions every time means they learn the concept, not a sequence of answers).


When the one minute's up, the questions are automatically marked and presented on a breakdown screen, giving instant feedback on how they've done. If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button reformats the question as a familiar manipulative display that mirrors the approaches used in the White Rose Maths schemes of learning.








Continuous Battleships PE Home Learning

'The biggest bug that ever lived!'

Researchers from University of Cambridge's department of earth sciences have found the largest-ever millipede fossil on a Northumberland beach! Palaeontologists say the fossil is from the "biggest bug that ever lived". It was discovered when a chunk of sandstone fell from a cliff onto the beach at Howick Bay.

“ It was a complete fluke of a discover ”

The rock had cracked open, revealing the fossil. "It was a complete fluke of a discovery," said Neil Davies, a lecturer at the University. The fossil was so large it required four people to carry it! Experts believe the specimen is a section of the creature's exoskeleton that it shed near a riverbed, which was then preserved by the sand. Scientists believe the ginormous creature, called *Arthropleura*, was alive

over 320 million years ago, weighed 50kg and was 2.5m in length, as long as a car! If you want to see the fossil it will be on display at Sedgwick Museum. Let us know if you go to see it or have seen any other impressive fossils!

Twins born in different years!

Aylin and Alfredo Trujillo, twins, born only 15 minutes apart, have birthdays in different years! The babies were born at Natividad Medical Center, in Monterey County, California. Alfredo was born at quarter to twelve on New Year's Eve, 31st December 2021 and his sister, was born just after the clock struck midnight, meaning her birthday is New Year's Day, 1st January 2022! Aylin was also the first baby born at the Medical Center in 2022. Experts say that twins being born on different days is

very rare but there is only a one in 2 million chance of them being born in different years. The twins' mother, Fatima Madrigal said: "It's crazy to me that they are twins and have different birthdays. I was surprised and happy that she arrived at midnight." Dr Ana Abril Arias, called the twins' birth "one of the most memorable" of her career. "It was an absolute pleasure to help these little ones arrive here safely in 2021 and 2022. What an amazing way to start the new year".
