
It's that time of year again—Summer reading challenge at the local libraries.







Family Fund

Helping disabled children



Family Fund helps families with disabled or seriously ill children with: grants, IT support, accessing benefits and information on other support available. If you feel you may benefit please look at the link below or speak to Mrs Holland or Mrs Haigh for help.

If you're raising a disabled or seriously ill child, we might be able to help. There are three things to consider when applying to Family Fund:

1. **Are your family eligible?** We help families living in the UK on low incomes. Check our [eligibility criteria](#) to find out if this could be you.
2. **If you have applied to us before,** [check when you can you apply again.](#)
3. **Is your child eligible?** We use our own criteria to assess your child or young person's additional support needs. Look at our [child and young person eligibility criteria](#) to see if we might be able to help.
4. **Get an application form.** If you've read the information and think you would be eligible, [you can get started right now](#) and [register to apply online](#), [download an application pack](#) or [we can send a pack to you.](#)
5. **We cannot provide an additional grant for a further child within the same family until:**



Dog nose prints

The wrinkles on a dog's nose are called a 'nose print.' Did you know that dog nose prints are unique, just like our fingerprints? This means that they can be used to identify lost dogs and reunite them with their families. A company called Petnow, from South Korea, has released an app that utilises AI technology for pet biometric recognition - phone based face ID for dogs. Upon finding a lost dog,

a person can use the app to scan the dog's nose and if the dog has been registered as lost, its location can then be sent to its owners. Stray dogs can therefore be checked by anyone to see if they are lost without any specialist equipment. Petnow says that it believes a dog's nose is the best feature to use for identification as after they are six months old a dog's nose print remains the same for its whole life!

Eco-friendly 'concrete'

Pioneer Fellow, Gnanli Landrou, is a man on a mission to make the construction industry more eco-friendly. The cement-free concrete he has invented and named Cleancrete, uses a special powder that can turn earth (which is recycled from building sites) and water into a solid building material. Once the ingredients are mixed together, they become a paste that can be moulded and which then solidifies in 48 hours! Turning mud into 'concrete' has a

far lower carbon footprint than traditional concrete and is about to be used in a new apartment block. This could make a really big difference as concrete is the most used building material in the world! Gnanli, who is working with ETH University in Zurich, said, "Cleancrete has the particularity to be 90% more eco-friendly than conventional concrete. Meaning that you have 90% less CO2 emitted during the production. This is a big factor."

Solar powered electric car

Lightyear have announced that their solar-powered electric car will be released this year. The Dutch start-up company claim that, thanks to the curved solar panels on its roof and a 60kWh battery pack, the Lightyear 0 will be able to drive for months without being charged! They say on their Twitter page "Our mission is to bring clean mobility to everyone, everywhere. So, we created the first long-range solar electric car."

The car has a 388-mile (625km) range, with 44 miles being generated completely from solar. To make the car even more environmentally friendly, its features include plant-based leather, fabrics made from recycled PET plastic bottles and wooden decorative elements made from sustainably restructured rattan palm. The car is currently priced at €250,000 (which is around £215,000)!

Requests to join the Scouts and Girlguiding groups have reached the highest levels for over 80 years. The Scout Association said nearly 90,000 young people across the UK are currently on waiting lists and Girlguiding has nearly 55,000 people waiting for a place. Simon Carter, national spokesperson for the Scout Association, said that in the last year, membership has grown by 16%. "We have not seen this level of growth since the Second World War," he added. "Lockdown was a grim period for young people. They couldn't go anywhere. There is now more zeal for the outdoors."
