

Dear Parents and Carers,





Lost Property


Already, we have several items of clothing, and a bag, on the lost property rail.

Little and often is the best way to practise and retain these important facts.




Maths

Miss Garrard says...

Could your child be eligible for Pupil Premium Funding?

If you receive one of the following benefits then your child may be entitled:

Qualifying benefits

- Universal Credit (annual net income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying)

What does this mean for your child?

£150 towards the following each year:

- School day trips
- School residential trips
- School clubs
- Peripatetic music lessons
- Snacks (reception)

You will also receive a £40 school uniform voucher to spend online at Jules at Home each year.


Keep on the Move PE Home Learning

Be SMART with a

It is extremely important that we know what our children are doing online and how we can keep them safe. The internet is an amazing invention, but at the same time, it is a very dangerous place for children. We want our children to reap the benefits of it but also keep them safe.

Children are accessing technology and the internet at a younger age than ever before. It's never too early to talk to your child about what they do online and who to tell if they come across anything online that makes them feel worried, scared, or sad.

Explore together: Ask your child to show you their favourite websites and apps and what they do on them. Listen and show interest and encourage them to teach you the basics of the site or app.

Be non-judgemental: Explain that you would never blame them for anything that might happen online, and you will always give them calm and loving support.

Supervise your child while they're online: Keep the devices your child uses in communal areas of the house such as in the living room or kitchen where an appropriate adult is able to supervise. It is not safe for 4-7-year-olds to access the internet unsupervised in private spaces, such as alone in a bedroom or bathroom.



S is for safe

Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online don't give away things like your full name, password or home address. Remember personal information can be seen in images and videos you share too. Keep them safe to keep yourself safe.



M is for meet

Meeting up with someone you only know online, even a friend of a friend, can be dangerous as this person is still a stranger. If someone you only know online ever asks you to meet up, for personal information or for photos/videos of you then tell an adult straight away and report them together on www.thinkuknow.co.uk



A is for accepting

Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.



R is for reliable

You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check in books and talk to someone about what you have found.



T is for tell

Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online. There are lots of people who will be able to help you like your teachers, parents, carers or contact Childline – 0800 11 11 or www.childline.org.uk



Be SMART with a heart

Remember to always be smart with a heart by being kind and respectful to others online. Make the internet a better place by helping your friends if they are worried or upset by anything that happens online.

Baby elephant steps

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo in Bedfordshire has published a recording, captured on hidden cameras, of an endangered Asian elephant taking its first, slightly wobbly steps, just hours after being born. The Zoo tweeted to announce the calf's arrival, "The not-so-tiny infant was born to mum Donna at around 7am on Monday, surrounded by the rest of the females in the herd, including her own mum Kaylee – who provided reassurance and support with gentle trunk nudges and

murmurs." Visitors to the zoo can see the little elephant with the rest of her herd at the Centre for Elephant Care. Deputy team leader of elephants at the UK's largest zoo, Mark Howes, said, "To say we're delighted by the arrival of this calf is just a huge understatement. This little infant is a really important addition to the European-wide endangered species breeding programme for Asian elephants."

Quadri-dextrous artist

Rajacenna Van Dam, a talented Dutch artist, uses both feet and hands at the same time to create six realistic portraits upside down! Rajacenna, who describes herself as an international ambidextrous hyper photorealistic pencil drawing artist, said, "In 2019 the idea came to me to be more productive because I didn't make any artworks for the previous years due to health issues. I didn't practice it at all and just started doing it." The quadri-dextrous

internet sensation from Rotterdam created photo-like portraits of Bella Poarch, Harry Potter, Billie Eilish, Wonder Woman, Shakira, and Angelina Jolie in her video. The incredibly technical pieces of artwork can take up to 40 hours to complete. She comments that she prefers to draw people that she loves and that inspire her and has also created an online tutorial, which demonstrates how others can learn to draw with both their hands.

The Queen has died peacefully, aged 96, marking an end to her historic reign. Buckingham Palace today confirmed the news. Her Majesty Elizabeth II is the longest serving monarch in British history.

Her son, now King Charles III, said the death of his beloved mother was a "moment of great sadness" for him and his family and that her loss would be "deeply felt" around the world.

Who was Queen Elizabeth II?

👑 Elizabeth was born in London on 21st April, 1926 and as a young girl, a lot of her childhood was spent during WW2. In 1940, she gave her first speech on the radio at the age of just 14, sending her best wishes to children who had been evacuated to keep them safe from the war.

👑 Elizabeth was crowned Queen Elizabeth II on 2nd June, 1953, in Westminster Abbey, at the age of 25. During her reign, she has seen huge changes in Britain, from wars and pandemics to overseeing 15 different prime ministers!

👑 Queen Elizabeth II ruled Britain for longer than any other King or Queen in history, spending over 70 years on the throne.

👑 It's thought by many, Queen Elizabeth II will be remembered as a Queen who spent her life keeping the promise she made when she was first crowned - to serve her people and her country.

I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong.
